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out during judging. Blue, Red, White ribbons will be distributed on the last Saturday of fair along with premiums. Any department wanting to distribute any additional ribbons will need to purchase themselves and distribute.

- K. Any person attempting to interfere with the judges or anyone who publicly voices disapproval of the judge's decision shall forfeit any awards won.
- L. Decisions of the judges shall be final subject only to written protests which shall be acted upon.
- M. There is a universal release time from 7:30 - 9:00 a.m. on the final Saturday of fair. All articles must be claimed by 9:00 a.m. The Extension Office and Fair Board will not be held responsible for picking up articles not claimed.
- N. In no event, shall the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair or the Sherman County Extension Office be held responsible for any loss or damage to the property or person of exhibitor or other persons while on the fairgrounds whether said loss or damage shall arise from accident or any cause whatsoever.
- O. All protests must be made in writing to the president of the fair board, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds of protest. Such protests must be filed on or before 3:00 pm of Friday of fair.
- P. All premiums may be picked up at the time of scheduled exhibit release. Open Class will receive their premiums from the Fair Office near the entrance to the grandstands. All unclaimed checks will be in the Sherman County Extension Office for 3 weeks following the fair. After 3 weeks, they will be turned over to the Fair Board. All checks will be void 90 days after fair.

- E. The livestock shows will be a no fit show, “Blow and Show”. No fit, at the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair is defined as using no adhesive, glue, paint, creams, or powder products. Anything used to alter or enhance an animal’s performance or look is illegal. Animals using show products will not be allowed to enter the show ring.
- F. The superintendents will assign stalls and pens and offer supervision of the livestock exhibits. All animals must be housed in barns. Bedding must be used in pens or stalls except in the beef barn which is bedded in sand.
- G. Any exhibitor not providing feed and water for their animal during the fair will forfeit all prize money and/or awards.
- H. Livestock must be stalled 2 hours prior to show time and are free to leave after the show. All market livestock will be entered and weighed at a specified time (see entry and judging schedule page). Animals should be clean and free of debris.
- I. Northwest Kansas District Free Fair board is not responsible for lost or injured animals that are taken outside of the livestock barns’ perimeter fence anytime during the fair. Encouraged to keep animals properly stalled. If it is necessary to exiting the perimeter animals must be properly controlled.
- J. Registration papers must be presented or proof of application for registry for animals entered in purebred classes.
- K. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor. All livestock must be shown by the owner unless the superintendent grants permission for a representative to take the place of the owner.
- L. Each exhibitor must care for and groom his or her own animal and may use only the assistance of a family member. No hired professional groomers will be allowed. This rule will be strictly enforced and any exhibitor violating it will have their animal in questions eliminated from competition.
- M. Animals may compete as an individual and/or component of a group.
- N. Exhibitors must maintain and keep their stalls clean or forfeit any prize money. Stalls must be cleaned after removing animals when leaving grounds.

◆ 4-H GENERAL RULES

- A. This division is only open to youth in good standing with 4-H.
- B. Pre-entry is required and should be posted on Fair Entry (www.nwksfair.fairentry.com) on or before the designated deadline. Deadline is on the entry and judging schedule page of this book.
- C. All entries are final after the fair pre-entry deadline (deadline can be found on the entry and judging schedule page of this book). Absolutely no changes will be accepted after the pre-entry deadline. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make sure all entries are entered correctly prior to the fair pre-entry deadline.
- D. All ages are as of 1-1 of the current year.
- E. Exhibit tags must be filled out for each entry. 4-H tags may be obtained at the Sherman County Extension Office before the fair. 4-H tags may be filled out and attached before the fair or at entry time.
- F. If an entry is made in the 4-H division, it cannot be entered in the Open Class division. 4-H'ers must be currently enrolled in the project to enter a 4-H class; otherwise the entry must be made to Open Class.

- G. Only 4-H members will be seated with the judge during consultative judging. Parents may stand in proximity to hear comments but may not contribute to the conversation. (Necessary accommodations may be arranged in advance.)
- H. All Premiums will be: Blue \$3, Red \$2, White \$1 unless otherwise stated.
- I. NWKS Fair will only purchase Blue, Red, White, Grand, Reserve, and Class Ribbons. Award ribbons will be given out during judging. Blue, Red, White ribbons will be distributed on the last Saturday of fair along with premiums. Any department wanting to distribute any additional ribbons will need to purchase themselves and distribute.
- J. Showmanship monetary premiums supplied by FNB Bank, Goodland, KS (paid at the time of judging) Blue \$3, Red \$2, White \$1.
- K. Outstanding exhibits will receive a State Fair award. Those will be screened for State Fair based upon available State Fair classes and the age of the exhibitor. It is the responsibility of the individual 4-H member to pre-enter state fair entries in writing to the Extension office.
- L. If there are fewer than 3 exhibits in a class, discretion of the judge will be used on champion and reserve champion awards.
- M. Any person attempting to interfere with the judges or anyone who publicly voices disapproval of the judge's decision shall forfeit any awards won.
- N. Decisions of the judges shall be final subject only to written protests which shall be acted upon.
- O. There is a universal release time from 7:30 - 9:00 a.m. on the final Saturday of fair. All articles must be claimed by 9:00 a.m. The Extension Office and Fair Board will not be held responsible for picking up articles not claimed.
- P. In no event, shall the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair or the Sherman County Extension Office be held responsible for any loss or damage to the property or person of exhibitor or other persons while on the fairgrounds whether said loss or damage shall arise from accident or any cause whatsoever.
- Q. All protests must be made in writing to the president of the fair board, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds of protest. Such protests must be filed on or before 3:00 pm of Friday of fair.
- R. All premiums may be picked up at the time of scheduled exhibit release. 4-H will receive their premiums from the Fair Office near the entrance to the grandstands. All unclaimed checks will be in the Sherman County Extension Office for 3 weeks following the fair. After 3 weeks, they will be turned over to the Fair Board. All checks will be void 90 days after fair.
- S. Family and Consumer Science Award - An Overall Family and Consumer Science Award will be given to the top 4-H youth in Senior, Intermediate, and Junior divisions who accumulate the most points in the following projects: Foods/Nutrition, Arts & Crafts, Home Environment, Needlework, Knitting Crocheting, Clothing Style Revue. Three points will be given to each blue, two points for red, one point for white, with two additional points for each champion and one additional point for each reserve champion. This award will be presented at the 4-H Achievement Awards Reception.

- E. 4-H'ers must be enrolled in a foods project to be eligible to participate.
- F. All exhibits must have been preserved since the fair of the previous year.
- G. Recommended method of processing must be used. Open kettle processed foods and oven canned food will be disqualified. Pickles and sweet spreads must be finished by the water bath process. Low acid products must be pressure processed properly for the altitude of residence. The label must include the canning method and process time.
- H. Each exhibit must have the complete recipe and instructions attached with entry card, or it will be disqualified. Recipe must include exhibitor name, recipe source, date of publication, and altitude, where food was processed. If using Mrs. Wage's or Ball® mixes, indicate the date the mix was purchased.
- I. Exhibits must be processed in clean, clear standard canning jars, with matching brand (ex: use Ball® lids on Ball® jars, or Kerr lids on Kerr jars, etc.) two-piece lids. Do not use colored jars, fancy padded lids, fabric over wraps or cozies as they interfere with the judging process. No fancy packs unless recipe states to do so (ex: Pickled asparagus). Jars must be sealed when entered. For food safety reasons, the size of jars used must not be larger than the jar size stated in the recipe (ex: Salsa is canned in pint jars only, no quarts). Note: There are 12-ounce, 24-ounce and 28-ounce canning jars available and may be used. Use pint jar process recommendations for 12-ounce jars. Use quart jar process recommendations for 24 ounce and 28-ounce jars.
- J. Each jar exhibited must be labeled. The label must not cover brand name of jar. The label must give: Class Number, Product, Altitude where processed, Canning Method (water bath, weighted gauge or dial gauge pressure method), Process Time, Pressure (psi), Date processed including month and year, Name, and County/District. Jelly must be in ½ pint or pint jar. All other products must be in pint or quart jars.
- K. Hole-punch the entry card and use a rubber band to attach entry card around the top of the jar.
- L. Recipes with ingredients and instructions are required.
- M. Alcohol is not allowed as an ingredient. Entries with alcohol will be disqualified.
- N. There are no safe recommendations to can white peaches or elderberries.

- O. Jellies are to be in standard jelly jars. Preserves, jams and butters may be in standard pint or half-pint jars. Fruits, vegetables and meats may be in pint jars.
- P. Food Preservation - Sweet Spreads and Syrups, Fruits and Juices, Low Acid Vegetables [Green Beans, Corn, etc.], Pickles and Relishes, Meats, Tomato and Tomato Products, etc.

- E. No alcohol or illegal drugs to be used in food.
- F. No frosting or glazes.
- G. The entire product must be entered and uncut - no half cakes. Exhibit 3 cookies, 3 muffins, 3 bread sticks, etc. Cookies and rolls must be the same shape and same recipe.
- H. Entries shall be displayed on foil-covered cardboard or on paper plates and slipped into a food grade plastic bag. Baked products should be removed from the pan and placed on paper plates or cardboard; otherwise, exhibit in a disposable container. Pans will not be returned (example: glass pie plate).
- I. Recipes with ingredients and instructions are required for all food products exhibited including food gift packages.
- J. Layer cakes must be two or more 8" or 9" layers, unfrosted.
- K. All unfrosted cakes should be exhibited in an upright position with crust showing, except for those cakes made with special designs such as bundt cakes. They should have top crust side down. No mixes should be used.
- L. All pies need to be a two crust, pastry, or crumb. For food safety purposes, no cream pies will be allowed. Nut (pecan) pies are acceptable.

- M. Pan size for all quick breads and yeast breads need to be 9" x 5" x 3".
- N. For food safety purposes, any food with glazes, custard and cream cheese type fillings and frostings, flavored oils, "canned" bread or cakes in a jar, or food requiring refrigeration will not be accepted.
- O. Exhibitors 7-8 years old are eligible to bring sandwiches and salads but need to be kept cold before judging and must be taken home after judging.
- P. Exhibitors 7-8 years old will not be eligible to participate at the Kansas State Fair.
- Q. All food preparation entries will be considered the property of the 4-H Council. These entries except for a display sample will be sold at the annual 4-H Food Sale. Sale will take place in the 4-H Foods Department in the Ag Building after the food judging has started and last until food is gone. All proceeds go to aid the 4-H Council.
- R. Decorated Food Item - A decorated food item must be a food item, not a decorated box. Judge will evaluate the decorating and not taste the food item. Not eligible for Kansas State Fair.
- S. Educational Exhibit - Exhibits may be in the form of a poster, notebook, or display. Follow copyright laws as explained in the General Rules as you are preparing your exhibit. Take care to select materials that will withstand State Fair conditions. No card table displays are allowed. If the exhibit is a poster, it must not be larger than 22" x 28". Displays are not to exceed a standard commercial 3' x 4' trifold display board. Name and county or district must be clearly marked on educational exhibits. NOTE: A collection of your favorite recipes in a recipe box or notebook does not constitute an educational exhibit.
- T. Food Gift Package - No alcoholic beverages will be accepted. A food gift package must contain at least 3 different food items (prepared for human consumption), made by the 4-H member, in a suitable container no larger than 18"x18"x18". Prepared food items must have recipes attached with the entry. Additional homemade food items beyond the 3 minimum or purchased items may also be included in the gift basket. On the back of the entry card, answer these questions: a) what is the intended use; b) what food safety precautions were taken during and after preparation. Home canned foods must follow Food Preservation rules. Canning jars should not be used for baking per manufacturer's instructions. They could break during baking.

- R. Digital Composite Image - Finished photo must be created from two or more original sources created by exhibitor. HDR photos do not qualify for this class Photos will be judged on photographic merit as well as manipulation technique and process. Ribbon placement will be determined by combining the score of each judging section.
- S. Digital Composite Image - Photo must be created from two or more originals taken by the exhibitor. Exhibitor must include a second 11 x 12-1/2 matte board (Explanation Board) mounted with standard size prints of the original photos, 3 x 5 card(s) explaining what manipulation was done and a standard size print of the final photo. Optional, may include prints of editing steps. Photos showing editing steps may be layered. Please put name and extension unit on the front of the second board. Explanation boards will be displayed as a group to explain and promote the class. Place both matte boards in the same protective plastic bag.
- T. Video - Entries must be full motion not a series of still images with pan or zoom motion added by a software program. All content must be the result of the current year's project work. All content must be original and created by the exhibitor(s) unless signed copyright, use and/or performance releases are provided. Entries may be created by an individual or by a team. Talent, computer editing, titles, graphics, animation and music are allowed and recommended. Entries must be one of the following production types: Instructional, Informational, Documentary, Persuasive/PSA, Story or Entertainment. Length must be no longer than three minutes with the exception of Persuasive/PSA which must either be 30 seconds or 60 seconds. Entries will be evaluated on design characteristics, technical content, production quality, and effectiveness. Entries not adhering to the rules and requirements will be awarded a ribbon one placing lower than the placing determined by the official judges. Videos must be in a DVD standard format, so as to be playable on a laptop computer.
- U. Portfolio - Member is eligible for this class beginning with

- the third year of enrollment in the 4-H photography project.
- V. Portfolio - Exhibit will consist of one photo for each year of enrollment. Each photo must have been created in a different year and must be labeled with the year taken/project enrollment year. This introduction should tell why the 4-H member enrolled in the Photography project and why they have continued to enroll. Exhibitor could also tell of a fun event photographed, a learning experience that taught them new skills or other related learning.
 - Z. Portfolio - Beginning with photo 2 (two), member description of GROWTH in project skill must be included on information sheet.
 - AA. Portfolio - Exhibit will consist of introductory page, skill sheet and photo from each year photos arranged in chronological order, and arranged in a portfolio book. Skill sheet will go in left hand page and unmounted photos in right hand page.

- E. The livestock shows will be a no fit show, “blow and show”. No fit, at the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair is defined as using no adhesive, glue, paint, creams, or powder products. Anything used to alter or enhance an animal’s performance or look is illegal. Animals using show products will not be allowed to enter the show ring.
- F. All market animals must have an identification tag. Breeding and dairy animals are strongly recommended to have an identification tag, but not required.
- G. The superintendents will assign stalls and pens and offer supervision of the livestock exhibits. All animals must be housed in barns. Bedding must be used in pens or stalls except in the beef barn which is bedded in sand.
- H. Any exhibitor not providing feed and water for their animal during the fair will lose the right to sell any animal in the sale and forfeit all prize money and/or awards.
- I. No livestock in barns before 8:00 a.m. Monday of fair. All animals (including poultry and rabbits) should be stalled by 7:30 a.m. Tuesday of fair. All animals (marketing, breeding, dairy) need to remain in the barn until at least Friday 12:00 noon at the end of fair. If an animal needs to leave early for whatever reason the decision must be approved unanimously by the superintendent, fair board, and the extension office.
- J. Any animal weighing less than minimum or more than maximum may take as many trips as needed across the scale to make weight until scale is closed. Animals should be clean and free of debris. Weight limit will be strictly enforced by the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair board.
- K. Weigh in will be conducted at the discretion of the superintendent in an orderly fashion. If an exhibitor chooses to waive his/her spot in line (exhibitor must notify superintendent), the exhibitor must wait until all other animals are weighed and weigh in at the end.
- L. Any animal that does not make weight (over or under) can show in the show but cannot sell or participate in the grand drive. Only those meeting the weight requirements will be allowed to sell in the 4-H livestock sale. Others may sell at a floor price if a bid can be obtained for those animals.

- M. Producer certification forms are required and due at time of weigh-in for every animal. Exhibitor will not be allowed to show or sell if the producer certification form is incomplete.
- N. Animals must be withdrawn from all drugs according to withdrawal time on any given drug. Any animal not meeting withdrawal dates by weigh-in of the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair will not be allowed to show or sell. This is in compliance with federal regulations of all animals entering any processing locker.
- O. All animals are subject to examination by the exhibition staff or their representatives, and shall be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.
- P. If the 4-H'er is unable to attend a show, another Sherman County 4-H member can show in their place. If exhibitor has more than one animal in the same weight class, a Sherman County 4-H member must show the other animal. This applies to all species, all classes, and all shows.
- Q. Exhibitor can only transfer an animal from exhibitor with in the immediate family because of sickness or death with the animal. Transfer must be approved unanimously by the superintendent, fair board, and the extension office.
- R. Each exhibitor must care for and groom his or her own animal and may use only the assistance of a family member, Sherman County project leader, or another Sherman County 4-H member who is an exhibitor at this year's livestock show. No hired professional groomers will be allowed. This rule will be strictly enforced and any exhibitor violating it will have their animal in questions eliminated from competition.
- S. Exhibitor is required to own the animal (breeding, dairy, market). The same animal cannot be shown in both market and breeding classes.
- T. First and second blues places in each class are eligible to compete for champion and reserve champion market animal regardless of class size, if the judge feels it is a worthy entry.
- U. 4-H Homegrown Livestock - The purpose is to give an opportunity for locally produced animals to be used as projects and receive recognition. The animals must be bred, managed, and produced by a Sherman County livestock operator. Homegrown determination needs to be made at spring weigh-in. Homegrown awards are determined during the final drive of each market class. Breeding animals are not eligible.
- V. Tri-state royal showman representative for the county will be designated for each specie by the judge at the end of the showmanship judging. Champions of the three age divisions will return to the ring for judging.
- W. Northwest Kansas District Free Fair board is not responsible for lost or injured animals that are taken outside of the livestock barns' perimeter fence anytime during the fair. Encouraged to keep animals properly stalled. If it is necessary to exiting the perimeter animals must be properly controlled.

4-H Livestock Sale

- A. Each exhibitor will be eligible to sell only one market beef, one market sheep, one market goat, and one market swine. All other exhibits are not eligible. Exhibitors must sell their highest placing animal, but may substitute the next highest placing animal if he/she guarantees to exhibit the animal at a major approved show or wishes to retain female animal

for breeding. Lightest weight animal will be used; member won't be able to sell a higher weight than the original animal. If an animal brought to the fair makes necessary (healthy) weight limit, but is not shown, the exhibitor loses the right to sell the animal.

- B. It is the responsibility of the 4-H member to submit the appropriate paperwork to specify which animal they are going to sell at the 4-H livestock sale as soon as possible following the show, but no later than Thursday 12:00 noon.
- C. Grand and reserve champions of all species will sell at the beginning of the 4-H livestock sale. The sale rotation order for that year will be followed for the grand and reserve as well as the sale of the other animals.
- D. Livestock Sale Rotation Order - The specie that is in the top position will rotate to the bottom position and all others will move up accordingly. 4-H livestock sale order can be found in the appendix of this book.
- E. The Northwest Kansas District Free Fair Board has determined that if an animal goes through the sale that it is not to be made available for re-sale. What happens to the animal is to be the first choice of the buyer (ship to sale barn, send to a locker, or take home). If anyone wants to buy an animal for breeding purposes, they must go through the superintendent and the appropriate paperwork is to be filed with the superintendent and the clerks. Any corrections or questions should be dealt with only after the conclusion of the sale.
- F. Market animals will be released and shipped at the discretion of the superintendent. The Northwest Kansas District Free Fair Board will do its best to arrange loads for delivery to lockers, but don't always count on that. You may have to deliver it yourself. Animals sold during the 4-H livestock sale will take priority, extra animals will follow. The Northwest Kansas District Free Fair Board is still planning on making shipping arrangements for animals that are shipped to the sale barn at floor price.

Herdsmanship Award

- A. All livestock and small animal exhibitors are automatically entered into the herdsmanship contest as a club. This is not an individual contest. It is vital that our 4-H'ers learn the importance of properly taking care of animals, keeping the barns clean and presentable, and working together as a team.
- B. There will be a separate award for each barn; beef, sheep, goat, swine, poultry, and rabbit. Herdsmanship will be checked daily for the duration of the fair with no designated time of day each day. The judging committee will be superintendents from each of the livestock projects listed previously and one representative from the fair board. The winner of each barn will be selected during the afternoon of fair on Friday. Awards will be presented during the 4-H livestock sale. Checks (if applicable) will not be issued until the completion of the fair and all barns are clean. A club failing to properly clean up after fair will forfeit their award.
- C. Herdsmanship duties are the responsibility of all exhibitors and club members rather than leaders, advisors, or parents. If an exhibitor is going to be gone for any reason, it is their responsibility to ask another club member to water, feed, and care for their animals.
- D. Clubs do have an opportunity for bonus achievement points with livestock educational displays. This is a bonus, it

can only help a club not hurt them. Livestock educational displays are encouraged to be informational, creative, innovative, etc. Displays can be posters, stall displays, etc. and should be in place by Tuesday noon of fair and remain up all week. Clubs with displays are required to collaborate with the respected species superintendent for available space.

- E. The herdsmanship judges will use a scoring guide in judging the contest. Judges will use one scoring guide sheet per club for the entire week. Herdsmanship judges will judge all barns. Scoring guide is available on the Northwest Kansas District Free Fair website (www.nwksfair.com).

Round Robin Showmanship

- F. All participants will arrive at the livestock show ring promptly 30 minutes before the show to review the rules and take the round robin quiz. See fair schedule for date and time.
- G. The round robin showmanship contest gives an opportunity for champion showmen from the 4-H divisions in beef, swine, sheep, goats, and horse to compete head to head for the best all-round showman honors at the fair.
- H. Exhibitors must receive a blue ribbon in showmanship to qualify for the round robin showmanship contest in a species.
- I. There will be four (4) species of animals shown: beef, swine, sheep, and goat. Horse champions will be eligible to participate in round robin and horse will not be shown as part of the event due to space restrictions.
- J. The grand champion showman in beef, swine, sheep, goat, and horse will be eligible to compete in the round robin show.
- K. An exhibitor receiving grand champion in more than one species must inform a superintendent which specie they want to represent in round robin within 30 minutes of the completion of that exhibitor's last species.
- L. If for some reason the grand champion showman cannot or chooses not to show, the reserve grand champion showman in that specific species and age group will be eligible. Should the reserve grand champion decline, no other exhibitor will be considered.
- M. The superintendent or their designee of the five (5) species will work together to select five (5) animals that are suitable to be shown by multiple exhibitors with all showmen showing the same species in the ring at the same time. The superintendent or their designee will gain approval from the owner of each animal for their animal's participation. If five (5) animals cannot be identified for whatever reason, champions of all five (5) species will be eligible to participate in round robin with the species that are represented.
- N. Participants must ask for permission before working with someone else's animal or equipment prior to the show.
- O. Each exhibitor will be assigned a number for identification. Participants will draw the number of the animal they will show immediately preceding the competition. They may not show their own animal.
- P. There will be a 10-question general knowledge quiz (2 questions per species) to be used as a tie breaker. Participants will take the quiz prior to the start of the round robin contest.
- Q. The round robin committee will determine the order of the show. It may vary from year to year depending on the

number of participants in each division.

- R. The judge(s) will use a numerical scoring system to grade each individual in each species. Each judge will use the same scorecard to evaluate each participant.
- S. The round robin judge will be asked to rotate animals shown by exhibitors at least once in each species to help even out differences between animals.
- T. Each species, judging, and judge comments will last no more than 10 minutes (7 minutes with 3 minutes of judge comments).
- U. Ties will be broken: First, by the scores on a 10 question written quiz. Second, by the smallest difference between the highest and lowest species scores. Third, by the highest species score.
- V. The round robin committee (beginning in 2020) will be comprised of the superintendent or their designee of the five (5) species. The decision of the judge(s) and the round robin committee are final.

- A. To be eligible to show, all market goats must weigh a minimum weight of 50 pounds. There is no maximum weight. Animals are eligible to sell must weigh a minimum weight of 50 pounds.
- B. Any breed or cross breeds will be eligible to compete.
- C. All market goats must be born after 1-1 of current year to be shown.
- D. All market goats will be weighed and classes will be broken into weight classes upon the decision of the show superintendent.
- E. All goats must be penned in the designated areas.
- F. All goats must be shown with all four feet on the ground. Exhibitors may use a collar, a collar with a short lead, or a halter when showing. Medium (3mm or smaller) pinch collar will be allowed.
- G. Horns should be tipped and rounded.
- H. No bucks of any age will be allowed on the grounds. Only does and wethers can show.
- I. All market goats must have baby teeth in place with no visible signs of permanent teeth.
- J. Caseous Lymphadenitis, active fungal (ringworm), or sore mouth: All goats must be inspected and have no visible signs of these conditions.
- K. All goats are required to have a scrapies tag.

Market Sheep

- A. To be eligible to show, all market sheep must weigh between 90 to 165 lbs. Animals are eligible to sell must weigh between 90 to 165 lbs.

be shown.

- D. All market sheep will be weighed and classes will be broken into weight classes upon the decision of the show superintendent.
- E. All sheep must be penned in the designated areas.

- G. All sheep must be free of any signs of “sore mouth”.
- H. All sheep must be free of signs of active fungal (ringworm) infection, including club lamb fungus.
- I. All sheep are required to have a scrapies tag.

Market Swine

- A. To be eligible to show, swine must weigh between 220 to 300 lbs. Animals are eligible to sell must weigh 220-300 lbs.
- B. Any breed or cross breeds will be eligible to compete.
- C. Boars must be cut to show.
- D. All market swine will be weighed and classes will be broken into weight classes upon the decision of the show superintendent.
- E. All swine must be penned in the designated areas.
- F. Catch-It-Pig - Rules and regulations are available at the Extension Office or online at www.nwksfair.com or www.sunflower.ksu.edu. Rules and regulations are those of the Catch-It-Pig Committee and their decision on all matters is final. The contest is open to all Sherman County youth age 7-13 as of September 1 of the current year. Youth may not be enrolled in the swine project. Contestants must have written consent of a parent or guardian. The Northwest Kanas District Fair Board and the Catch-It-Pig Committee will not be responsible for any accident or injury connected with the contest. Completed application must be submitted prior to the deadline.
- G. Catch-It-Pig - Is eligible for market swine grand champion and reserve grand champion.

Poultry

- A. The KS Department of Ag has a 5-year rotation for the Pullorum-Typhoid. Participants will be notified when the rotation will be in Sherman County. Chickens must originate from a Pullorum-Typhoid clean flock as evidenced by a properly signed form OR evidence that the entry was purchased from a P-T clean source and have been physically separated from infested flocks OR present a properly signed form indicating that the entry has had a negative P-T test within 90 days prior to the above.
- B. Premiums will be withheld if poultry are not fed, watered, cages cleaned daily and assistance is not given in Saturday clean-up after release.
- C. All poultry going on to state fair should have numbered leg bands.
- D. All birds must be deloused prior to the show to assist in prevention of the spread of diseases and parasites. Do not

bring entry if there is a sickness in the flock.

- E. Poultry signs may be placed on cages after judging--not to exceed 4" x 12" and are subject to the superintendent's approval.
- F. Judging will be done primarily on the basis of exhibition qualities as described in "The American Standard of Perfection".
- G. Designate breed of poultry on entry tag for each exhibit.
- H. Young bird is under one year of age.

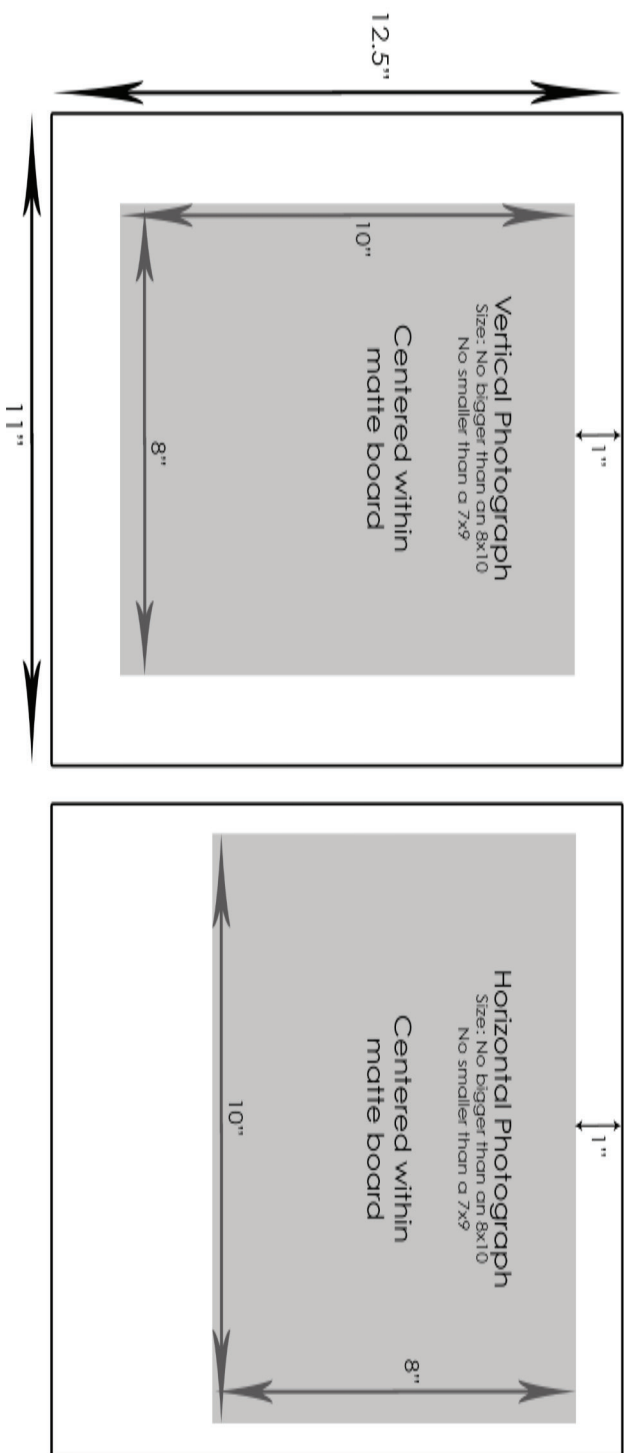

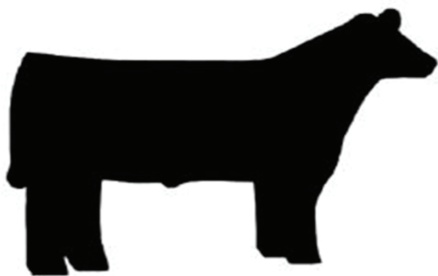
